From the Pastor

Friends, please take of yourselves and each other in this dangerously cold weather! Just a reminder that UPC activities will continue as planned as long as emergency officials deem it safe to be out and on the roads. We will always choose to be good stewards of public health and will adjust activities 1) if emergency officials recommend it and/or 2) if road conditions in our area are unsafe. As you know different governments oversee different road conditions; and while a county road may be cleared and safe, a state road may not. Changes and updates will be available on WLWT in case of closure and on the website, social media and email in the event of adjustments.

This Sunday is the 2nd Sunday after Epiphany and the Sunday before MLK, Jr. Day of Remembrance and the inauguration. How might the Spirit be inviting us to consider how our public and private lives as disciples influence and inform each other? What are the ramifications for us as individual disciples and as a family of faith?

With those questions in mind, I invite you to prepare for worship by reading and praying about Psalm 36:5-10. The psalmist reminds the hearers of God's steadfast love and provision. How does this challenge and/or comfort folks living in a broken and hurting world? How do we understand the nature of God and God's provision in the midst of suffering?

Then, read and pray about 1 Corinthians 12:1-11. How would the original hearers of the text been influenced by their understanding of God's constant provision and the reality of suffering? How do your understandings about the nature of God color how you experience the text? Given our historical context on the cusp of an inauguration and the remembrance of the life and ministry of MLK, Jr, how might the Spirit be challenging and/or comforting us as individual believers and as a faith family?

Help care for our unhoused neighbors by donating books and/or headphones!

Because Boone County does not have a shelter, unhoused neighbors are placed in a local hotel during life threatening cold. Folks may be sharing a room with people they do not know. Anxiety is high, and patience is strained. Guests who cannot get along are exited from shelter. Having something to do - like reading a book - and being able to tune out other people with headphones can lower anxiety and keep the peace.

Books for adults - particularly crime, suspense and thrillers - and headphones that can plug into a cell phone can be dropped off in the narthex and in the office vestibule in the back of the building. Thank you in advance for your generosity that helps keep our neighbors safe during this cold.

Congregational Meeting & Lunch Sunday, January 26th

The meal will be prepared by the Deacons. No need to bring anything but yourself. This annual meeting is for the Session to present the 2025 Budget, for the congregation to approve Pastor Lisa's 2025 terms of call, and to elect

the 2025 Officer Nominating Committee. In the PC-USA, the Session approves the budget and is presenting it to the congregation for information. The Session recommends the pastor's terms of call; however, the congregation calls the pastor and is the body that must annually approve the pastor's terms of call. Finally, the Session presents names for the Officer Nominating Committee with a representative from the Music Program, the UPSeniors group, the Session, the Deacons, and a member at large. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor provided that the person nominated has already agreed to serve. The 2025 Officer Nominating Committee will help our congregation discern who the Spirit is leading to serve as Deacons and Elders in the class of 2028.


